

Colorado State Capitol

The conference is in the Old Supreme Court Chambers located at the north end of the second floor of the Colorado Capitol, which is on the south side of Colfax Avenue between Lincoln and Grant Streets in Denver.

Parking within walking distance is plentiful. There is a garage at 17th and Lincoln, a surface parking lot at 16th and Lincoln, and smaller lots on Grant and Logan between 16th and 19th Avenues.

The Capitol has four doors entered by steps ascending to its main floor, one facing each cardinal direction. These doors are opened at 8:00 am daily.

There are two ground-level doors for handicapped access located underneath the south and north stairs. These open into the building's basement. The south ground-level door is opened at 7:00 am daily. There is elevator service between all floors.
