Why should you join?

- The Law Review is the oldest student-run journal at the Sturm College of Law.
- The DU Law Review gives you two opportunities to be published as a student.
 - We publish up to 4 student case comments each year.
 - Our annual Tenth Circuit Survey, one of four issues we produce each year, consists almost entirely of student-written papers.
 - Student authors typically work with faculty members who help provide guidance in writing these papers.
- By participating in the Law Review you will learn how to edit and improve articles submitted to our Law Review for publication by professors, judges, and practitioners throughout the nation.
- Having the Law Review on your résumé when seeking employment or clerkships is an excellent benefit.
- Participation on the Law Review gives you an advantage in your legal career for many years to come.
- Membership affords you the opportunity to meet other students on our Law Review through social events during the year.

Important details about candidacy:

- **What it is:** Candidacy for the DU Law Review emphasizes highly developed legal analysis and bluebook/ editing skills. All law students must complete a write-on competition consisting of a case comment and a bluebook/edit exercise.
 - Candidates who accept membership **must serve a two-year commitment** for which they may receive up to a total of six credits.
- **Who can participate:** This year's candidacy will be **open to all first-year day and evening students, as well as second-year evening and dual-degree students** provided they have not previously completed the Law Review candidacy.
 - This will be the **only opportunity for first-year day students to join** the Law Review.
- **When it is:** Candidacy for the 2008-2009 DU Law Review **begins on Friday, May 16th at 12:00 pm and ends on Monday, June 2nd at 12:00 pm.**
- **How to get more information:** The DU Law Review will hold formal Informational Sessions, focusing specifically on the candidacy process and expectations for members of the Law Review. In addition the DU Law Review will hold an informal Meet & Greet. Please try to attend.
